Objectives of Funding Scheme



Advancement of biobank activities and infrastructure at certain research locations.

- Comprehensive centralization of existing biomaterial banks
- Advancement of national biobanking infrastructures to facilitate integration into European activities (BBMRI)



Objectives of Funding Scheme



Funding can be provided for:

 centralizing existing biobanks and implementing comprehensive biobanking structures

Funding cannot be granted for:

- establishing new biobanks or collecting specific biomaterials
- biobanks focussing on certain diseases
- concepts federating biobanks supra-regionally



Local Prerequisites



- at least one high quality biobank with a comprehensive data base
- at least one biobank having given samples to peer-reviewed research projects that have resulted in peer reviewed publications
- implemented quality management/ assurance and data safety



Local Prerequisites



- willingness/cooperativeness to comprehensively exchange data/ material
- spatial conditions allowing the operation of a biobank according to international standards
- solid and sustainable financial concept to maintain the research infrastructure



Funding Details



- Duration of funding: up to 5 years
- Volume of funding: appr. 17 Mio Euro



Evaluation Process



In response to the public call 29 proposals were submitted applying for a total of

111 mio €.

Evaluation by an independent interdisciplinary international review board.

5 proposals recommended for funding



Kick-off Workshop



The evaluation process has identified common problems with regard to the implementation of centralised biobanking infrastructures.

It was strongly advised to cooperatively address these issues in an attempt to match policies (no isolated solutions).
