#### The German Setting: Distributed Responsibilities


federal system (16 states) many responsibilities (e.g. data protection) at state level 52 ethics committees relevant legislation power at state level (e.g. data protection, public hospitals) funding of research at federal level, but funding of infrastructure at state level Federal Ministry of Health - Federal Ministry of Research multiple players (35 universities with medical faculties, several nonuniversity research organizations such as Helmholtz, Max Planck, Fraunhofer and Leibniz) no powerful central institutions at federal level (exc. Robert Koch Institute and a few others)

- non-profit umbrella organization for academic research consortia and institutions
- ☐ established by the Federal Ministry for Education and Research (BMBF) in 1999
- ☐ funded by three federal ministries: BMBF (Education & Research), BMG (Health), BMWT (Economy & Technology)

- engaged in EU-funded projects (FP7, ESFRI, Innovative Medicine Initiative)

# **TMF and Biobanking: Conclusions**

Bottom-up approach
<ul> <li>important for acceptance and sustainability</li> </ul>
Foster continuous interdisciplinary collaboration
□ infrastructural matters
<ul> <li>legal and ethical matters</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>methodological matters</li> </ul>
Avoid duplication of efforts
<ul><li>no parallel projects or infrastructure (no "research waste")</li></ul>
<ul> <li>no diversification of organizations, committees, events etc. unles absolutely necessary</li> </ul>
Gain impact
<ul><li>reliability (services, tools)</li></ul>
<ul><li>liability (concepts, legal matters)</li></ul>
